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CARE AND CLEANING OF CULTURED MARBLE PRODUCTS

The cultured marble products shipped to you have been manufactured to rigid quality standards, tested and certified by a laboratory using testing methods developed by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI Z124.1 – 4). Our cultured marble is a durable products that, with proper care and cleaning, will have long-lasting beauty. The care given to the surface determines the life of the product.

Normal Cleaning:

Glossy Surface:

The surfaces of glossy finished, shiny cultured marble products should be cleaned with a soft cloth and a non-abrasive cleaner, such as the liquid soaps used to wash dishes, or ammonia-free spray cleaners. **Do not use foaming products or abrasive cleaners.** Any cleaner that feels abrasive when rubbed between the fingers should not be used on a glossy cultured marble surface. After cleaning, a periodic application of a quality non-abrasive paste wax will add a barrier of protection and retain the luster and shine of the glossy cultured marble surface.

Matte Surface:

The matte finished, non-glossy cultured marble product may be cleaned with a fine, abrasive cleaner, but preferable only when the surface has been stained by cigarette residue or other staining agents. Daily cleaning of matte finished cultured marble products should be done with the same type of cleaner as the glossy cultured marble product. Do not use any paste wax on the matte finish.

Tough Cleaning and Removal of Scratches:

Glossy Surface:

Some cigarette stains, other mild stains and shallow scratches can be removed from a glossy cultured marble surface by using a wet-n-dry #600 grit or higher sandpaper and water, followed by polishing with a fine rubbing compound, and an application of paste wax.

Matte Surface:

Most stains on matte finished surfaces can be removed with a Scotch-Brite™ or similar pad and a kitchen cleanser containing bleach, or by using only the light sanding technique as described above (Do not polish or wax the surface).

Caution:

Any cultured marble surface can be damaged by abrasive utensils, such as a razor blade or metal scraper, and household solvents, such as fingernail polish remover or paint thinner.
